Reading— This week we will be reading *Justin and the Best Biscuits in the World*. This is a longer story therefore you may want to re-read the story on Thursday night just for extra reading practice. The reading test will be Friday. We will also be doing literature circle projects as we wrap-up *Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing (Room 9)* and *Shiloh (Room 10)*.

Religion- We will be skipping to Chapter 6-*Liturgical Year*. **There will be no test this week**, but we will be exploring the church calendar with a variety of activities.

Math- Ch. 3. Addition and subtraction of large numbers, which involves borrowing – test will be Tuesday, October 25th. Reviewing these concepts at home will be a good way to reinforce these concepts.
